WHAT KIND OF A DEGREE AM I RECEIVING?

Beginning in the fall of 2007, Multnomah students now have an opportunity to major in Elementary Education, along with Bible, completing a B.S. degree that qualifies them to be recommended for initial teacher licensure in Oregon.

Currently, students may qualify for a teaching license at two authorization levels: Early Childhood and Elementary. Graduates receiving these authorizations can teach preschool, kindergarten, and in grades 3-8 in self-contained classrooms.



HOW LONG IS THE PROGRAM?

Multnomah's Elementary Education Program is 130-semester credit hours, which can be done in 4 years. The program has three strands: Bible/theology courses, professional education courses, and general education courses. All of these credits are designed to uniquely prepare Multnomah graduates to fulfill the mission of the Teacher Education Program.

WHAT IS THE MISSION OF THE PROGRAM?

With a firm foundation of a love for God, His Word, and people, our mission is to prepare educators who think critically, respond compassionately, and work strategically so that our graduates may enter any educational setting—public, private, international, corporate, secular, or sectarian—qualified to meet the needs of every student capably and effectively.
