

Marvin Otto Johnson

Marvin Otto Johnson was born July 3, 1925 in Portland, Oregon, to Otto A. and H. Adina (Swanson) Johnson, both natives of Sweden. In 1943, Mr. Johnson graduated from Milwaukie High School in Milwaukie, Oregon. He attended Oregon State College on a football scholarship before enlisting in the Army Air Corps for the remaining two years of World War II. Following the war he returned to OSC where he received his Bachelor's degree in 1949 and his Master's degree in 1953.

Beginning his teaching career in 1950, Mr. Johnson taught students in Japan, France, Saudi Arabia, Oregon, Arizona, Nevada and California. He retired in 1987 and passed away on October 2, 2009, in San Clemente, California. Marvin was passionate about teaching and would be pleased to know this scholarship will allow students to share his love of educating others by passing the spark of knowledge from one generation to the next.

In memory of Marvin and his educational legacy, the purpose of this scholarship is to help future teachers inspire students for many years to come.

Multnomah University | Marvin O. Johnson Teacher Education Scholarship

PURPOSE

This scholarship is intended to help defray the costs and expenses of qualifying students who attend Multnomah. It is restricted to expenditures for tuition to Multnomah, required textbooks for Multnomah classes or programs, or fees related to education at Multnomah.

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT

BA – Elementary Education students: Up to \$5,000 will be awarded per year on a funds-available basis. Students who continue to meet criteria are encouraged to re-apply annually. MAT students: Up to \$5,000 will be awarded for the entire MAT program, provided the student remains in good standing with a 3.0 cumulative GPA.



RECIPIENT SELECTION

A scholarship committee will review applications and select the most qualified students to receive the scholarship.

SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

Students who meet all of the following requirements are eligible to apply:

- Admitted student in Multnomah's Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education program or Master of Arts in Teaching program
- Continuously enrolled full-time, without gaps in attendance (exceptions may be made for extenuating circumstances)
- Maintain a cumulative and a current 3.0 GPA

APPLICATION PROCESS

- Complete and return the Johnson Teacher Education Scholarship application and all required documentation.
- Be fully admitted into the Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education program or the Master of Arts in Teaching program by the respective deadline.
- Complete the FAFSA online at www.fafsa.gov.
- Complete the Multnomah Aid Application online at www.multnomah.edu/myfinaid. (FAFSA must be received by Multnomah to be given access to this website.)



DEADLINE

Students wishing to be considered for the Johnson Teacher Education Scholarship must have completed the application process by the deadlines listed below:

- BA – Elementary Education students: April 1st
- MAT students – Fall Start: April 1st
Spring Start: October 1st

INSTITUTIONAL AID POLICY

All Multnomah funds will be awarded to qualified students who are personally committed to faith in Jesus Christ without regard to the student's gender, race, color, handicap, or national and ethnic origin. Students may only receive one Multnomah scholarship or discount in combination with the Multnomah Grant. The Financial Aid Office will award whichever discount or scholarship is most beneficial to the student.
