Chair, Master of Arts in Counseling Program Assistant/Associate Professor of Counseling

Multnomah University Graduate Department in Counseling invites applications for a full-time Assistant/Associate Professor with an anticipated starting date of July 2014. Candidates should possess a doctorate in counseling or counselor education. (Ph.D. or Psy.D.). The appointee will chair the graduate level program in counseling, teach appropriate courses in counseling, manage and supervise the curriculum and adjunct instructors within the department, mentor students in the program and work with the university to envision and anticipate program growth. The ideal candidate will have experience teaching in a higher education setting and be familiar with a variety of non-traditional educational delivery systems and modalities. Preferred candidates will be able to assist in efforts to pursue CACREP accreditation and should hold a counseling license such as Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC) or be eligible for and willing to pursue licensure.

All candidates must embrace the Protestant evangelical faith as listed in the university doctrinal statement. In addition, they should have a substantial biblical and theological foundation and be able to demonstrate a strong commitment to the integration of faith and learning. Teaching excellence is a high priority with service, advising, and research also expected. Women and minorities are especially encouraged to apply.
