

ELEMENTARY EDUCATION with ESOL ENDORSEMENT MAJOR

4-Year Plan for Bachelor of Arts - Catalog/Academic Year 2016-17

An important distinctive of this degree program is that students admitted to MU declaring *Elementary Education w/ESOL* as their major must also apply, in spring of the sophomore year, to Multnomah's state accredited "Teacher Education Program". Only upon successful admission to the "program" may students advance to their junior year in this major. Also distinctive to this major are the **EDU, LIN** and **PSY306** classes which are considered **professional educator** coursework by the state licensure agency. Because this is an accredited licensure program, a 2.75 cumulative GPA is required in these "major" courses, and no grade lower than a "C" is considered passing. An overall MU GPA of 2.50 is also required. These classes must be successfully completed in sequence as they are considered pre-requisite to program procession and continuance. The one exception is that transfer sophomores will take EDU102 along with EDU221 and LIN452 in their first Spring semester, as these are required prior to "Program Admission".
