Scholarships may be awarded to students who apply on or before August 1st.
Primary consideration will be given to applications received before April 1, 2018.*

SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTION:

The intent of the Cultural Engagement Scholarship is to support our commitment to diversity and fulfill Multnomah's mission to become culturally engaged servant leaders. Multnomah University desires to be an educational institution where all students flourish and possess equal opportunity for success. The Cultural Engagement Scholarship seeks to identify students who will enrich their peers' learning experience through academic competence and cultural engagement as Multnomah strives to be a globally influential University.

With these initiatives in mind, please share with the Scholarship Committee how your experience of overcoming adversity and commitment to cultural engagement will influence Multnomah's community.

CRITERIA:

Students who meet the following requirements are eligible to apply:

- An incoming freshman or transfer student who has applied to any Multnomah University Portland Campus Undergraduate program for the 2018-19 academic year.
- A student who has been admitted to one of Multnomah's Graduate or Seminary programs.
- New and returning international students who are admitted to any of Multnomah's programs.
- For US Citizens and Permanent Residents; a FAFSA with Multnomah's school code (003206) is required in order to assess eligibility for both federal and institutional aid. [Citizenship is not a requirement to apply for this scholarship.]
- Full-time enrollment status.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

- Submit your 300 word essay response to the question below along with your application for admission, no later than August 1st (initial review of applications begins the week of April 1st).
- Essay Prompt: *Please write 300 words describing how your experience of overcoming adversity and commitment to cultural engagement will influence Multnomah's community.*
- Submit your essay to finaid@multnomah.edu, along with the name and email address of a reference who can speak about your commitment to cultural engagement.

INSTITUTIONAL AID POLICY

All Multnomah funds will be awarded to qualified students who are personally committed to faith in Jesus Christ without regard to the student's gender, race, color, handicap, or national and ethnic origin. Multnomah's scholarship deadline is August 1st (students must be admitted and have a valid FAFSA on file, if also applying for federal financial aid). Priority will be given to students who apply early. This one-time scholarship will be awarded in amounts up to \$5,000. Continuing students seeking to be active in cultural engagement leadership may apply to become a Voices Scholar in consecutive years.
