SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTION:

Multnomah is pleased to offer a scholarship to new or returning students working toward a degree in Global Studies or Global Development & Justice at Multnomah University. The Global Ministry Scholarship is available for those students who are committed to serving within a missions context in under-resourced communities in developing countries around the world where there is great need. This is a one-year award of \$7,500. The Scholarship may be renewable, but a new application is required each year.

CRITERIA:

Students who meet all of the following requirements are eligible to apply:

- Full-time third or fourth year student of Multnomah University's traditional undergraduate program at the Portland campus, majoring in Global Studies, or
- Full-time student of Multnomah University's Master of Arts in Global Development & Justice degree
- Students must be in compliance with Multnomah's standards for student conduct
- Students planning to serve abroad for at least three years following graduation

I. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

- a. Include your first and last name, Student ID#, email address and phone # on your essay.**
- b. Please write 400-500 words describing your previous international experiences and vocational commitment, with specific plans upon graduating for your career serving in the field of international development and/or social justice work.**

II. ADMISSIONS/FINANCIAL AID REQUIREMENT

New graduate students must be admitted to the program by the scholarship deadline. All students requesting federal funds must submit a valid FAFSA by the scholarship deadline. The FAFSA may be completed online at www.fafsa.gov. Multnomah's school code is: 003206.

III. STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

By submitting an application to the Global Ministry Scholarship, I grant Multnomah University permission to share my information with the donor; acknowledging that the donor's influence is weighted. If awarded, I am willing to write a thank you not to the donor. Furthermore, I understand that if I am selected as a recipient, the Multnomah Grant will not also be awarded.
